## From the Minister's Desk

**“For we are God’s handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.”**

Dear Friends,

Having written last month of the challenges before the General Assembly, it was encouraging to see those major issues being taken seriously by the Commissioners meeting in Edinburgh last month. A reasonably strong Strategic Plan was thrown out in favour of instructing a new, much more radical plan for the Church to be brought to next year’s Assembly.

But in the meantime, instead of simply waiting for new reports to be drawn up, local Presbyteries and Kirk Sessions themselves are instructed to engage with the issues. The Church of Scotland is dying, and requires major local, regional and national reform if it is to have a future in our land.

Of course, God’s Church will continue. We also heard reports from all over the world, especially in sub-Saharan Africa and the Far East, of how the Church is growing, even exploding. The difference in the lives of individuals and whole nations is unprecedented. And that is part of the good news story.

Here in Scotland individual congregations and even some of our smaller denominations are seeing signs of new life and growth. But for most of the Kirk’s congregations – including ourselves – we are looking at shrinking and aging members declining towards a quiet farewell.

All Kirk Sessions have been instructed to meet in conference to discuss these matters and a joint conference session will be arranged for Barry and Carnoustie at the end of the summer. From there we hope to engage in wider discussions about the future direction of the church’s mission in our area.

These are indeed challenging times, and we will need to be ready to let go of some of the things we hold dear in order to reshape Church life, worship and witness to the community we seek to serve.

## CHILDREN'S HOSPICES ACROSS SCOTLAND CHAS

On June 9, I was invited to join the registered CHAS volunteers for their annual conference in Perth. A mother spoke of how their much wanted baby daughter was delivered early by Caesarean section, at a hospital in England, and immediately rushed away to the special care unit as she had multiple life-threatening problems. Everything the staff said seemed to be negative. After six months they were finally able to take their precious baby daughter home. With no relatives or friends they could call on, they felt totally isolated, as they tried to cope with their daughter's multiple needs.

Then the family moved to Edinburgh and were told about CHAS. Visits to Rachel House and help from 'CHAS at Home' have provided them with the life-line they so desperately needed. She said that when CHAS became involved they were able "to live as a family" - having someone to talk to not only about medical matters but being there to listen or at the end of the phone at any time.

Through her tears, she thanked not only the staff at CHAS but the registered volunteers and people like you and me who support CHAS through fund-raising events. The money we raise continues to help CHAS to support their family and others in similar circumstances.

Last year 435 children and their families were helped by CHAS. Yes, we can all help in some small way to change lives and bring some joy to even the shortest of lives.

Registered volunteers gave over 72,000 hours of unpaid time to CHAS last year and that's only the officially recorded time!



**Privacy Notice**

**Purpose of this Notice**

This Privacy Notice outlines the way in which the Congregation will use personal information provided to us. Personal information includes any information that identifies you personally, such as your name, address, email address or telephone number.

The Congregation recognises the importance of your privacy and personal information and we have therefore outlined below how we use, disclose and protect this information. The Congregation, jointly with the Presbytery of Angus is the data controller, because we decide how your data are processed and for what purpose. Contact details for us are provided below.

**How we use information**

We use the information you give to us:

- to administer membership records, including a Communion Roll and Supplementary Roll;
- for pastoral care purposes;
- in relation to participation in Congregational activities ;
- to provide you with information about news, events, and activities within the Congregation or the wider Church of Scotland;
- to provide the services of a parish church to the local community;
- to fulfill contractual or other legal obligations;
- to manage our employees;
- to further our charitable aims, for example through fundraising activities;
- to maintain our accounts and records (including the processing of Gift Aid applications);
- if CCTV is in place we have this for the prevention and detection of crime.

**Disclosure of information**

The Congregation will only share your personal information where this is necessary for the purposes set out above. Information will not be shared with any third party outwith the Church of Scotland without your consent unless we are obliged or permitted to do so by law.

**Basis for processing personal information**

The Congregation processes your information in the course of its legitimate activities, with appropriate safeguards in place, as a not-for-profit body with a religious aim and on the basis that our processing relates solely to members, former members or people who have regular contact with us, and that this information is not disclosed to any third party without your consent.

We also process information where this is necessary for compliance with our legal obligations; where processing is necessary for the purposes of our legitimate interests and such interests are not overridden by your interests or fundamental rights and freedoms; and where you have given consent to the processing of your information for a particular purpose.

**Storage and security of personal information**

The Congregation will strive to ensure that personal information is accurate and held in a secure and confidential environment. We will keep your personal information for as long as you are a member or adherent or have regular contact with us or so long as we are obliged to keep it by law or may need it in order to respond to any questions or complaints or to show that we treated you fairly. We may also keep it for statistical purposes but if so we will only use it for that purpose. When the information is no longer needed it will be securely destroyed or permanently rendered anonymous. ## Inaccuracies and Objections

If you believe that any information the Congregation holds about you is incorrect or incomplete or if you do not wish your personal information to be held or used by us please let us know. Any information found to be incorrect will be corrected as quickly as possible.

You have the right to object to our use of your personal information, or to ask us to remove or stop using your personal information if there is no need for us to keep it. There may be legal or other reasons why we need to keep or use your data, but please tell us if you think that we should not be using it.

If we are processing your data on the basis of your explicit consent, you can withdraw your consent at any time. Please contact us if you want to do so.

## ANGUS PREBYTERY SEMINARS

### 1 Introduction to Leading Worship

For those who might like to be part of a worship team, working with their minister and helping to take services when the minister is absent. This seminar is a brief look at what is involved in being part of a worship team and those who wish to take the commitment further will enrol for the Leading Worship series of seminars.

### 2 Leading Worship

This seminar is for those who are part of a worship team in their congregation. It goes through the preparation of a service of worship, the resources available to provide help and finishes with the groups preparing and delivering a short service.

### 3 Eldership in the 21<sup>st</sup> century

A review of the role of the elder for those who are considering the eldership, those new to the role and those who are experienced but want to refresh themselves and share their experience with the others.

### 4 Pastoral and bereavement care

A seminar looking at how we provide pastoral care for our congregations with the final session considering how we deal with visiting those who have been bereaved.

### 5 Session Clerks get together

To update themselves on new developments, and to share ideas.

### 6 Working with young people

This seminar is designed to bring together leaders from Sunday Schools, Clubs and Youth Groups in our congregations. There will be an opportunity to share experiences and examples of good practice.

### 7 Elders moderating their own Kirk Sessions

A request has been received for this course and we would encourage congregations to send participants.

### 8 Telling it naturally – how to talk about your faith

This seminar is designed to look at how we share our faith in everyday situations. The sessions will deal with:- A faith to share, Why do we share it & How to share my faith.

## CARNOUSTIE MEDICAL TRANSPORT HELPLINE

As many of you will be aware, if you are a registered patient with Parkview Primary Care Centre, you have access to transport through the Carnoustie Medical Transport Helpline, formally known as Carnoustie Community Helpline. It is a transport service run by volunteers to help those clients, who do not have any other way of getting to medical appointments, arrive and return home safely. The appointment could be with your GP or nurse or at Ninewells, Stracathro, and Kings Cross etc. Clients have also been taken to Edinburgh, Aberdeen or Perth as well, so the volunteer drivers can cover as many or few miles to the required destination as necessary. This is basically a free service but clients are expected to give a donation towards the cost of the trip and will be given an envelope from the driver with an idea of what their contribution should be. Our church, as do the other churches in the town, take up collections every year, usually around Christmas time, to help fund this work and many of the volunteers are also members of the various churches, so we are already active supporters of this well used and worthwhile service. However, more volunteers are needed urgently, both as drivers and telephonists. It is easy to find out more about how you can help by calling either of the numbers below or speaking directly to someone who already volunteers. If you do have any spare time during the week, telephonists only cover one hour per fortnight and drivers can do as many or as few trips as they want, please think about offering your services.
